## ATTENDANCE DUES

The Attendance Dues for students at Years 7 and 8 are \$444.00 per student per year and Years 9 to 13 are \$888.00 per student per year. This goes directly to the Hamilton Diocesan Office and it is used to meet the costs of Capital Works (providing school buildings) within the Diocese.

## **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

We do not like to see our families in financial hardship. While it is necessary for schools to collect fees to enable the wide range of education options to take place, we do not want any family to leave the College due to financial pressure. We have three areas of support that we can offer:

### **1. FINANCIAL SUPPORT for ATTENDANCE DUES**

Attendance Dues are a legally enforceable fee that is sent directly from the Hamilton Catholic Office and is used for the maintenance and upgrade of school buildings.

The Diocese offers financial support for families who cannot meet the full fee. Please see the College Office or your child's learning mentor to collect a form for assistance.

### **2. FINANCIAL SUPPORT for COLLEGE RELATED EXPENSES**

At the beginning of each year, parents are invoiced for the 'take home' component of modules/courses their child(ren) take or for excursions or stationery or for uniforms.

Due to the generosity of trust fund applications the College is able to offer financial support for families who have difficulty meeting the full costs. Please see the College Office or your child's learning mentor to collect a form for assistance.

### **3. BOARDING BURSARIES**

Due to the physical distance that some families' homes are from the College, students may be required to board within town. A boarding bursary is available for families in this situation. Please see the College Office or your child's learning mentor to collect a form for assistance.

### An explanation of the terms used:

**Vertical Form Time:** A vertical form comprises students from Years 7 to 13. Each vertical form has two teachers who provide a back-up level of pastoral support. Students remain in the same vertical grouping every year with the same teachers. This encourages vertical integration of students. The vertical group focuses on attendance and day-to-day administration matters.

**WRO:** This stands for Warning/Report/Out. It is the College's behaviour management system. If a student is placed on Report, they are required to meet the teacher at the end of the school day to discuss the issue.

## 2019 STATIONERY LIST – YEARS 7 to 10

All students in Years 7 to 10 are strongly encouraged to purchase a chrome book. Campion College has joined with other schools in Gisborne and across New Zealand in a curriculum focussed partnership called Manaiakalani. As part of this partnership the Manaiakalani Education Trust has managed to source a good supply of Acer C732 chrome books. These have been independently tested to be robust while providing good specifications and a comprehensive insurance policy. The chrome books are only available through Noel Leeming Gisborne and they cost \$510 although there are a range of finance options also available for families. **The chrome books are available for purchase at this price until the end of Term 1 2019. (Please refer to the attached 'flyer'.**

Students in Years 11 to 13 are also strongly encouraged to have their own digital device. Chrome books are suitable for most students at these levels but some students will prefer to have a higher specification laptop either because they prefer the higher performance or because they are taking some digitally specialised subject areas. (NB: These students will be aware of the type of device they would want).

Students are asked to bring their chrome book to school on their first school day to have it checked that it will work on the College internet.

The focus on each student having their own digital device has significantly reduced the need for stationery.

# UNIFORM GUIDELINES

The following guidelines seek to clarify issues relating to uniform and dress standards.

1. Students' appearance at all times should conform to acceptable standards. Wearing of the uniform should reflect positively upon the student and the College community. Clothing is to be kept in a good state of repair. Oversize clothing is not to be worn.
2. Non regulation clothing is not to be worn with the College uniform. This includes travelling to and from school (with the exception of wet weather gear).
3. **JEWELLERY** at the College will not be permitted with the exception of small personal items. The only jewellery allowed is:
  - One stud or sleeper per ear. No other jewellery is to be worn on the face (i.e. no nose studs, lip studs etc).
  - One signet ring (unobtrusive).
  - One plain wrist bracelet.
  - One necklace limited to a cross/crucifix or taonga may be worn. This is to remain at the discretion of the Management at all times.
  - Make up, fancy hair-clips and nail polish (other than colourless or natural) are not permitted.
  - Head bands must be black or Campion Green in colour.
  - Coloured hair-braiding is not permitted.
4. **HAIR** must be clean, tidy and clear of the face. Unusual variations of hair styles or colours are not permitted. For clarification this includes colours which would not be seen in a 'natural' state and haircuts such as mohawks. Males are to be clean shaven. Side burns are not to extend below the ear. These remain at the discretion of the Management.
5. **TATTOOS** are not permitted. There may be some consideration given for culturally significant tattoos, and in such circumstances prior approval should be gained from the Principal.
6. **SKIRTS** must be of reasonable length. Front pleated skirts are to be below knee length.
7. **SHOES** must be the regulation black leather shoes. Black lace up dress shoes for boys, black leather shoes with one strap across the foot for girls. Canvas or suede shoes are not permitted. Sports shoes, skate shoes, or sneaker type shoes (except for PE) are not permitted.
8. T-shirts, cycle pants and other garments worn under the uniform must not be visible.
9. Underwear must not be visible.
10. When wearing the College jersey, the jersey length should be below the bottom of the shirt. The shirt should not be visible below the bottom of the jersey.
11. All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the owner's name.
12. All non-uniform articles of clothing will be confiscated. Students who, for genuine reasons, are unable to wear full regulation uniform, are required to obtain permission from the Deputy Principal. **A loan garment will be issued where possible.** If this is not possible then a permit will be given to such students as long as they provide an explanatory letter signed by their parent/guardian. The permit should be applied for by going to the office by 8.30 am on the first day the item of non-regulation clothing is worn. A permit will only allow non-regulation items to be worn for a period of time considered sufficient to overcome the immediate difficulty.
