SENIOR BALL: SATURDAY 3 AUGUST

The date is finalised! The College Senior Ball has been confirmed and will be held at the Bushmere Arms on Saturday, 8 August.

We are hoping for a fantastic evening for all and we want the occasion to be both enjoyable and safe. We also want to support our student organising committee in the efforts they have gone to.

Bringing a large number of students together socially on a weekend night can result in a fun-filled evening but it also has a potential safety risk. As this is a school ball and we would not like to see our students exposed to harm as a result of the evening being held we wish to reiterate the rules for the Ball.

- The Ball will start at 8.00pm and continue to 1.00am. All students are to arrive between 8.00pm and 8.30pm.
- Students are not permitted to leave the Ball before 1.00am. Students are at the Ball for the entire duration of the Ball.
- The Ball is a formal occasion and students are expected to dress formally. Informal dress may result in refusal of entry.
- **Alcohol is not permitted at the Ball. Students who have consumed alcohol prior to the Ball are not welcome to attend. Any students who do not follow this requirement will be removed from the Ball.**
- Smoking, vaping and drugs are not permitted at the Ball.
- A high standard of behaviour is expected at the Ball.
- After Ball parties should not be held as they increase the safety risk for our students. We ask parents to please support us in this.
- Pre-Ball parties are fine to be held, but students must not drink alcohol at these parties. We ask for parent support in this.

The permission slip is attached with this newsletter and should be returned to the College Office by Wednesday, 5 August, 3.30pm at the latest.
